INSTRUCTIONS ON HOW TO APPLY.**

The advanced theatre elective is a year-long class. In addition to developing acting skills, students will perform a formal play in the auditorium and also participate in Jr. Thespian district and state competition. These activities will require some after school rehearsals. Students will also be inducted into the Jr. Thespian Society which is a formal ceremony at the end of the school year.

CHOOSING A MONOLOGUE INSTRUCTIONS

Students are to research, memorize and perform a monologue that is no longer than one minute. You can search the internet for a one-minute monologue that is age appropriate. Also Ms. Bland and Ms. Davidson have books where you can find a monologue. You will be able to scan a page or receive a copy.

WHEN PERFORMING A MONOLOGUE

- Enter the audition room (2-027) with good posture a smile on your face
- Stand confidently in front of the director(s) at center stage
- Look presentable: Hair combed and out of your face. Clothing is neat. Smile!
- Slate: Before you start acting, say your name, your current grade and the title of your monologue.
- To start your scene, say the word "Scene".
- Perform your monologue
- When you are finished, say the word "Thank You"
- Make sure you are doing your best performance.
